
History of St. Philip Parish in Atmore, Alberta



St. Philippe Church constructed in 1952




St. Philippe Rectory constructed in 1956

Rev. Fr. Jocelyn St. Arnaud	1952- 1955	St. Phillippe Roman Catholic Church was constructed in 1952 on three acres of land donated by Joe Duigou.
Rev. Fr. Albert Noel	1955 - 1961	The rectory was constructed in 1956 next to the church building. In 1957, the first, First Communion mass was held. In 1959, the St. Philippe cemetery grotto was built

Rev. Fr. Kerewau	1966 - 1971	The spelling of St. Philippe was changed to St. Philip
Rev. Fr. Hervé Tanguay	1972 - 1974	In 1972 a church renovation including pew benches and flooring took place.
Rev. Fr. Claude de Champlain	1974 - 1982	In 1975 the Bishop celebrated the first Confirmation mass. In 1976, the first outside mass at the St. Philip cemetery took place and this mass was continued for many years. In this same year, a new roof was constructed on the church.
