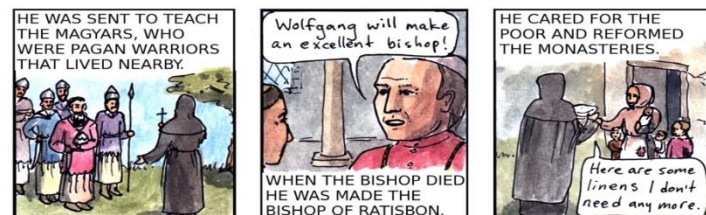

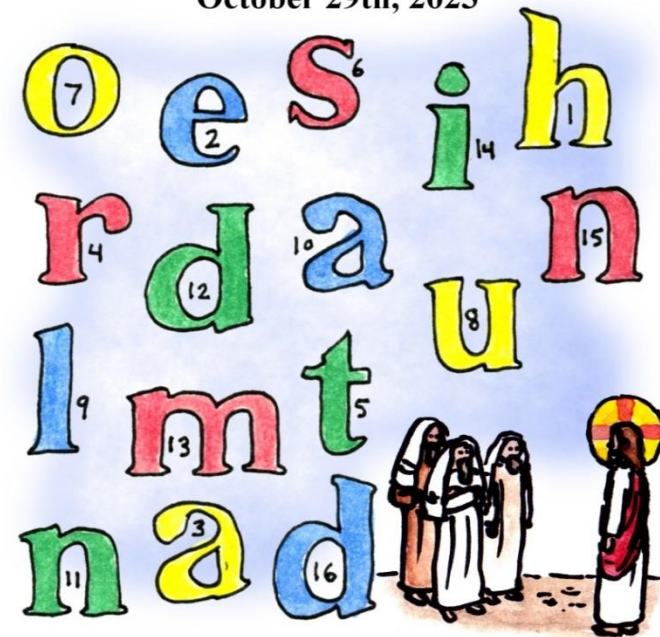

In today's Gospel, Jesus tells the scribes that the greatest commandment is to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength; and that the second is to love our neighbor as we love ourselves.

We are to hold nothing back; we are to give our lives completely to God. We are to love Him with our bodies, with our intelligence, with our hearts and our feelings, and our own soul.

God want us to give all of ourselves to Him and surrender all that we have and all that we are.

Moreover, we are not simply called to love God, but we are also called to love our neighbors as ourselves. This means that no matter what other people did in the past; we are called to love them as ourselves.

This month of November let us remember all the departed, especially those most dear to us.

In the Eucharistic celebration, we will pray in a special manner for our leaders who have already gone to their eternal reward. But while praying for the dead, let us not forget our present leaders, both religious and civil. We need leaders who can guide us with gentle firmness to the attainment of the common good. We need leaders who lead us by their example, who are deeply honest, humble and sincere; leaders who put the interest of the people before their own.

But as we raise this intention to the Lord, let us renew our commitment to become ourselves the good persons we expect others to be.
