

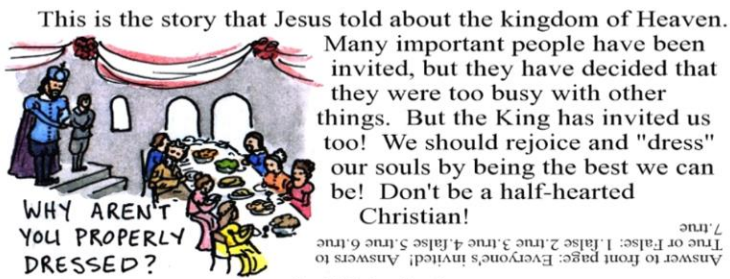
Invitation to the Wedding Feast

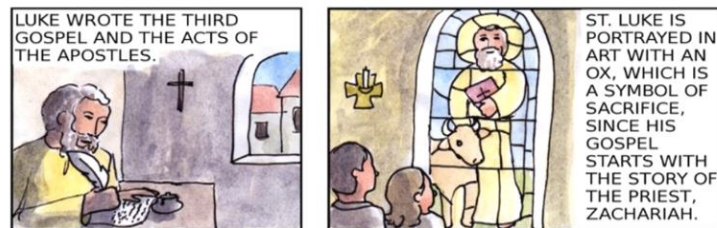
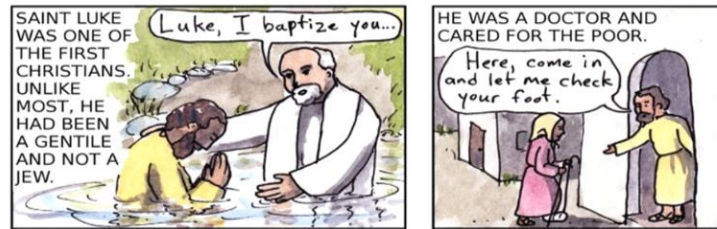

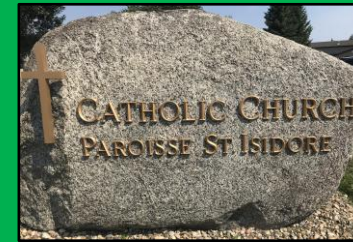
