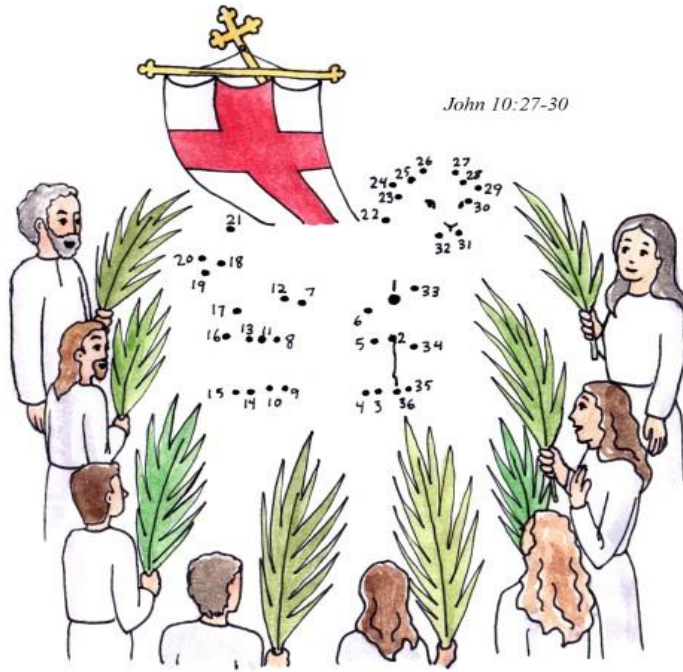

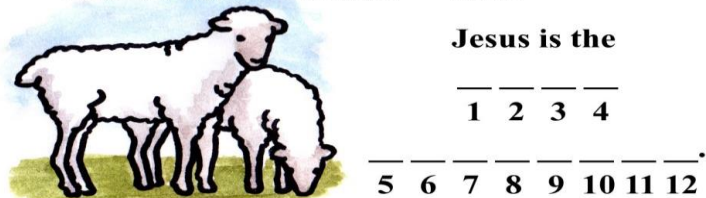

WE HAVE A POPE



Leo XIV is the new Pope

"Peace be with all of you!" - the first words of Pope Leo XIV. The Conclave has elected the first American and Augustinian Pope **Robert Francis Cardinal Prevost** as the 267th Bishop of Rome.

What to know

- Who is Robert Prevost?** The former pope, Francis, brought Prevost, 69, to the Vatican in 2023 to serve as the powerful head of the office that vets bishop nominations from around the world, one of the most important jobs in the Catholic Church. As a result, Prevost has a prominence going into the conclave that few other cardinals had.
- What is the order of St. Augustine?** Religious orders — which can include priests, nuns, monks and even lay people — dedicate themselves to a particular type of mission and spirituality. A core value of the order Prevost led is to “live together in harmony, being of one mind and one heart on the way to God.” Six popes before Leo XIV were Augustinians.
