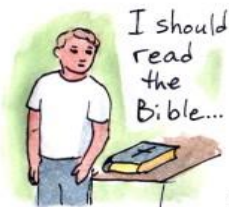


Jesus Promises to Send the Holy Spirit

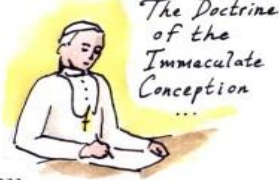
In today's Gospel reading Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit to the disciples after He was gone. The Holy Spirit would teach them all they needed to know.

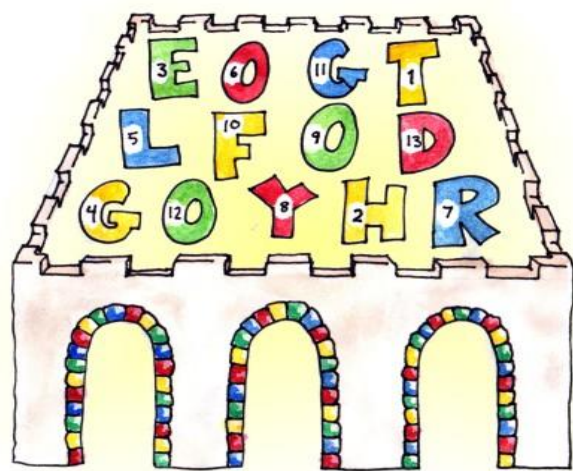

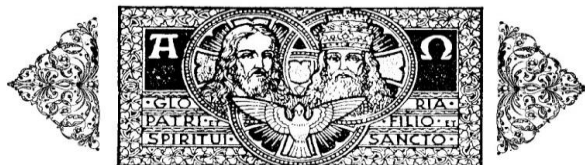

Ascension, Our Hope and Our
Challenge

The thought of an imminent separation from a person we love fills us with sadness. So it was with the disciples, after they learned from Jesus that soon they would not be able to see him any longer. But the Lord reassured them that LOVE would make up for the lack of his visible presence and would fill their lives with peace and strength.

After two thousand years, we know how true Jesus' words are. He is always present in the Church, his Mystical Body. In each of us, His presence becomes particularly real when we celebrate and receive the Eucharist, as we are about to do now. Let us open our hearts to receive in him the love of the Blessed Trinity, and to reciprocate it with the homage of our loving faithfulness. Let this Eucharist be our most treasured path towards radical newness!

Today, Ascension Sunday, we recall the glorification of Jesus Christ who, as a man, has been called to share in the glory of God. His ascension also reminds us that heaven is our destiny. That is what we have been created for. That is where we will find the perfect fulfillment of all our aspirations. But before we reach such a glorious destination, we have to do our share in the fulfillment of God's plan for ourselves and the rest of humankind. Jesus wants that we become more and more involved in the building of the Kingdom. That's why Jesus' ascension is also the indispensable premise for the beginning of the evangelization of the world through the Church.

Today is also "World Communications Day," an observance that emphasizes the importance of communications in the work of evangelization and catechesis, the need to pray for all those involved in the field of social communications. Let us include them in the intentions for which we offer this Eucharist.



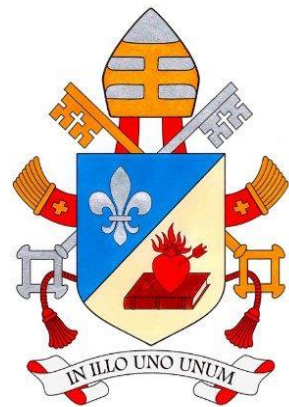
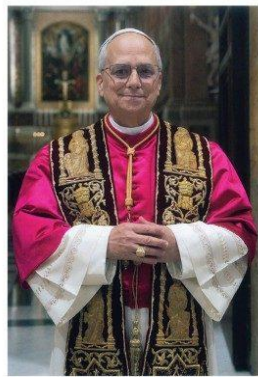
Announcement Corner

DID YOU KNOW?

The Ascension is a liturgical Solemnity celebrated by all the Christian Churches. It falls on the fortieth day after Easter Sunday. Saint John Chrysostom and Saint Augustine make reference to it, but it was probably Saint Gregory of Nyssa who influenced the propagation of the feast. Since it falls on Thursday, in many countries, this Solemnity is transferred to the following Sunday. With his Ascension into heaven, the presence of the "historical Christ" comes to an end, and the presence of the Body of Christ, the Church, is inaugurated.
